



Gestalt Africa Leadership Programme

A 12 month immersion in Afrocentric Gestalt OD for leaders, facilitators, coaches and consultants


The Gestalt Africa Leadership Programme supports growth and development in people, teams, organisations and systems. We offer processes and inputs that heighten introspection and awareness, empowering individuals to use their agency in work and social environments. We equip participants to manage the shift from new ideas and awarenesses, towards action and system's change, navigating the inevitable resistances that result. Participants will develop their presence and ability to influence through supervised client work with organisations in the countries we visit.

Programme Overview

The programme comprises 7 modules with a total contact time of 200 hours over 12 months.

In-person: Three 5½ day modules will be held in Accra (Ghana), Cape Town (South Africa) and Mombassa (Kenya)*

Virtual: Four 2 day sessions will take place on zoom, with pacing designed to support integration and application of learnings.



What you will get out of the programme

By participating in the Gestalt Africa programme, you will:

- 1. Know yourself better and experience change in yourself in ways that enable you to manage and lead yourself and others with purpose, respect and mutuality
- 2. Expand your awareness and capacity to embrace and engage with multiple realities, multiculturalism, diversity, inclusion and belonging
- 3. Experience the profundity of wholeness, and become more competent in enhancing total wellbeing of self, community, and environment
- 4. Become familiar with key Gestalt Theories, Concepts and Models, such as Figure-Ground, Cycle of Experience, Unit of Work, Resistance, Use of Self, Level of System, and Paradoxical Theory of Change, and be able to use them to shift human systems
- 5. Experiment with and apply Gestalt tools and techniques to strengthen your leadership skills, widening and deepening your ability to perceive and manage phenomenology and human behaviour for organisational effectiveness and social transformation
- 6. Practise the craft of Gestalt and experience the magic of influencing and leading change at all levels of human systems and be able to recognise, embrace and work with resistance
- 7. Experience the essence and power of community and how to function generatively for self and the collective
- 8. Build your confidence and capacity to influence and work creatively with complexity and large human systems
- 9. Immerse yourself in, explore and grapple with the role of dynamics such as trauma, power and hierarchy, spirituality and religion, dance, music and art, as they relate to African or Afrocentric ways of being, organising and leading, and the demands of corporate leadership and social transformation

Methodology

Our programme is based on perception research from Gestalt psychology, learning and change practices from Gestalt therapy, and the application of both to organisational development and leadership. The content is also informed by the latest neuroscience research as applied to the workplace, especially the neuroscience underpinning emotional intelligence. We draw upon proven approaches from intercultural communication and diversity work, transactional analysis, and approaches to healing individual and collective trauma, as well as work in organisation behaviour and systems thinking.


The program learning spaces are designed and facilitated according to researched adult learning principles. We offer experiences for self and group activities, teaching inputs on relevant theories and concepts, opportunities for experimentation and action and reflection space for integration and assimilation of learning. Participants learning is further supported by individual coaching sessions with faculty, and engagements with client systems in the cities we visit.

Certification

This programme offers Gestalt Africa Practitioner certification in two areas:


- · Leadership (for internal leaders and change managers)
- ·Organisation & Systems change (for external consultants and facilitators).

Certification is based on submission of a written account of how Afrocentric Gestalt learnings have been applied (6-12 months after completion of the course), and presentation of these learnings to a panel of senior Gestalt Africa faculty and associates. Fees will apply.
